After completing the dual-purpose curriculum (evaluate the University and the Soccer program) you will know if attending and playing soccer at WU is something you want to pursue.

Here is how this happens. The meeting with the Director of Admissions will highlight the extensive opportunities offered by WU. Living in the dorms will provide a taste for University housing.

The round table with present players will shed light on balancing the demands of soccer, academics and social life.

Interacting with fellow campers will give you an impression of potential future classmates. During camp you will assess the soccer program as you interface with the coaching staff and men's soccer team members. The coaching staff will provide you with your projected role within the team, should you apply, be admitted and choose to attend Washington University.

In fact, this past season there were 12 former campers active on our varsity or junior varsity teams (38%).
