IMPORTANT FACTS

Confirmation of enrollment and additional information will be sent to you upon receipt.

Free Ball to each camper when: **Family registration** (i.e. two or more from the same family registering for any 2009 camps) and/or **team registration** (i.e. ten or more from the same team, submitting their applications and deposits together by two weeks prior to camp).

Cancellation refunds are provided when **written notice is received two weeks prior to the starting date of the camp**. There is a \$35 administration fee assessed. Cancellations with less than two weeks **written notice** are refunded 50% of the camp enrollment fee.

Camp-ending injuries receive a pro rata refund up to a maximum of 75% of the tuition.

Each camper must have a ball. Purchase the camp ball or bring your own.

The parental consent form must be on file with the camp in order to participate.

The camp provides **secondary medical insurance**; it does not cover your primary coverage deductible, the excess policy deductible nor above the excess ceiling.

Certified lifeguards will be present at swimming activities.

The **camper-staff ratio** is generally 8 to 1. Specifically, the ratio will vary by age group with the youngest groups having the larger staffs.

Full-day June campers are to **bring their own lunch** in a sack with their name on it. We do not have refrigeration but do have lockers for storage. We provide drinks.

The campers often bring **spending money** for snow cones or the coin machines. The residential campers often order evening pizzas.

We divide the campers at the day camps by age, gender and ability. There is a group for all **playing levels**. The residential camps are for competitive players.

Friends are kept together.

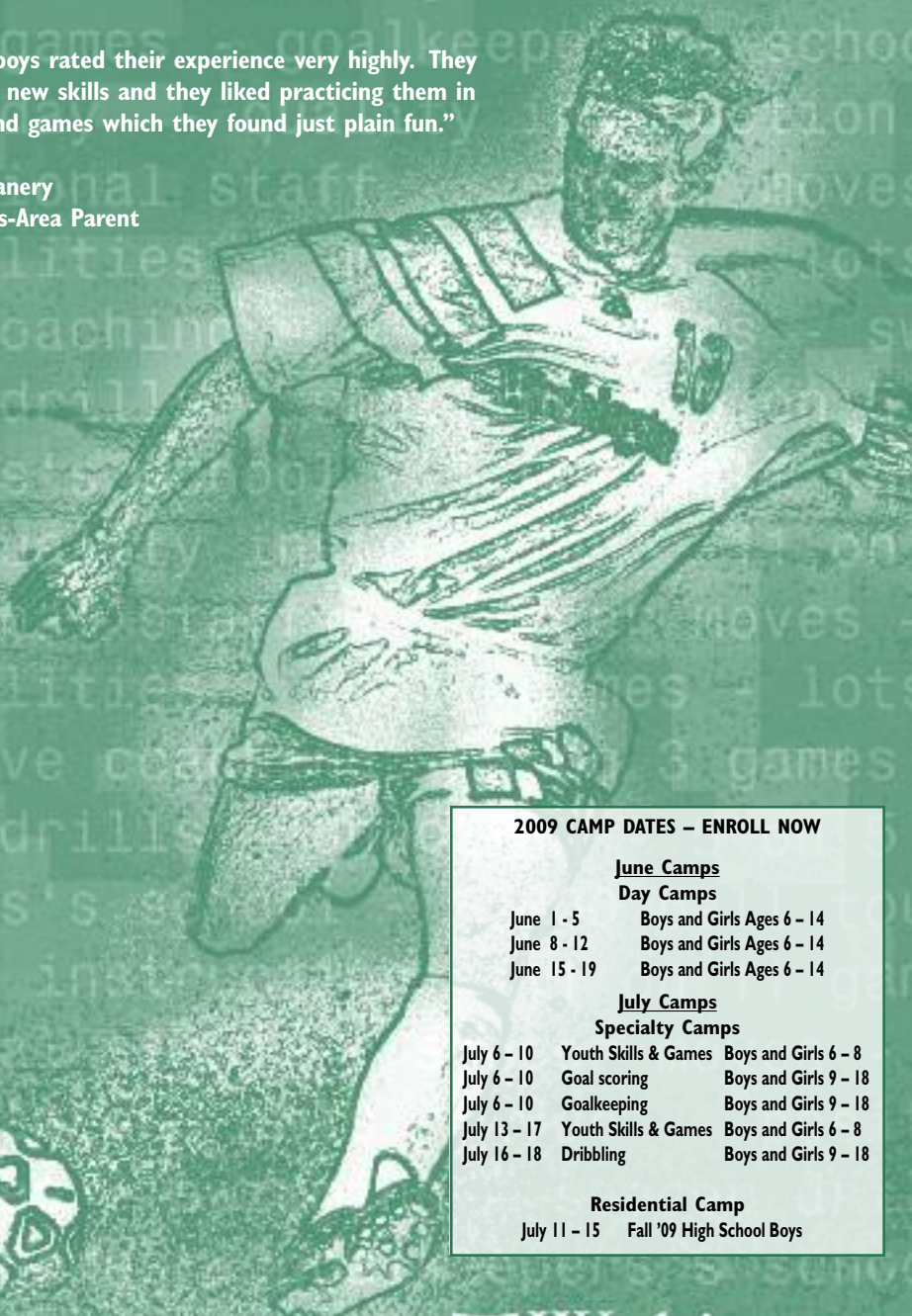

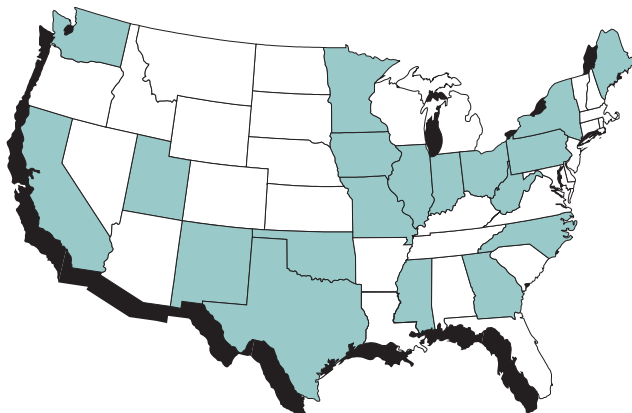
